# **ADVOCACY HIGHLIGHTS**



### 2021 / 87TH LEGISLATIVE SESSION

**HB 271**: Closed the background check loophole for new employees who have moved to Texas within the previous five years without requiring a more expensive and time-consuming fingerprint background check.

**HB 1681:** TALA Amendment created a generous grandfathering provision and limited the impact of the bill to just Harris County and new construction in the 100-year floodplain.

**SB 8 (3rd Special Session):** Secured a \$46 million grant program for assisted living communities to spend on staff recruitment, retention, bonuses, and upskilling.

## 2019 / 86TH LEGISLATIVE SESSION

**HB 3329:** Further defined an assisted living community as a provider that may provide Health Maintenance Activities.

## 2017 / 85TH LEGISLATIVE SESSION & SPECIAL SESSION

**SB 1049:** Established a life safety regulatory framework that is more predictable, is not overly duplicative with other state agencies, and provides for conflict avoidance with local authorities.

- Consistency: Requires technical memorandums with binding guidance on surveyors to be issued and the adoption of the 2012 LSC.
- Clarified that the TDLR has authority over accessibility. If TDLR has
  passed a facility during initial licensing, HHSC cannot cite the facility
  for an accessibility violation.
- Clarified that local municipalities have local code and regulation (IBC/IFC) enforcement/interpretation authority. HHSC must accept a local authority's decision on local code compliance.

**HB 924:** Created a more fair and balanced Informal Dispute Resolution Process for Assisted Living communities.

**HB 284** – TALA amendment to exempt restraint-free communities from placing a wheelchair lap-belt.

## **PAST LEGISLATIVE SUCCESSES**

- Created a bypass, for ALFs in good standing, to regulation which requires ALs move in 1 but no more than 3 residents. Good standing ALs can get licensed right after LSC inspection.
- Allowed residents to access nursing services in assisted living.
- Clarified a resident has the right to age-in-place.
- Improved the IDR process and added arbitration as an option to the administrative hearing process.
- ❖ Added ALs to priority list for **electricity restoration** in extended power outages.
- Created an expedited LSC inspection and provisional license option for existing providers.
